Statewide Transit Plan (SWTRP) Strategies

GDOT's Statewide Transit Plan divided transit development strategies into three categories, which were used to help classify and develop alternatives for evaluation:

- Transit Service Expansion
- Transit Service Enhancement
- Administrative Tools and Guidance

Transit Service Expansion

Expand Span of Service to Inlcude Weekends

 Increase transit service to include more times when current and potential riders may have mobility needs

Expand Capacity of Existing Rural Systems

Expand capacity to meet demand and serve the region's aging population

Incorporate All Rural Systems into a Single System

 Fully regionalize rural transit to address major intercounty travel between Thomas and neighboring counties

Transit Service Enhancement

Additional Fare Options and Subsidies

 Allow recurring reservations and discounts; assist riders by ensuring they have a ride for regularly scheduled events, such as medical appointments or weekly shopping trips

• Utilize QRyde online booking and GDOT's Let's Ride mobile booking and payment

Administrative Tools and Guidance

Advertising Campaign

 Conduct joint social media campaign with area agencies to promote awareness of the region's available transit services

Unify branding across all fleet vehicles in the region and market Let's Ride app


Central Phone Number

 Provide a single point-of-contact for ride booking and route callers to the appropriate dispatch offices


Website Update
